#### **EGYPT**

- On 16<sup>th</sup> June 2011, Egyptian health authorities reported to WHO 2 new A(H5N1) human cases in Menufia governorate (cf. map 1).
  - The 1<sup>st</sup> case is:
    - A 21 year old pregnant woman;
    - Onset of symptoms on 21<sup>st</sup> May 2011;
    - She died on 29<sup>th</sup> May 2011.
  - The 2<sup>nd</sup> case is :
    - A 16 year old male;
    - Onset of symptoms on 21<sup>st</sup> May 2011;
    - He has recovered.
- On 22<sup>nd</sup> June 2011, Egyptian health authorities reported to WHO a new case of A(H5N1) human case in Qena governorate (cf. map 1).
  - The case is:
    - A 27 year old male;
    - Onset of symptoms on 5<sup>th</sup> June 2011;
    - He died on 14<sup>th</sup> June 2011.
- Contacts with contaminated poultry have been documented for all 3 cases.
- In Egypt, the last A(H5N1) human cases were reported on 8<sup>th</sup> June 2011 in Cairo and Qalyubiyah governorates (cf. [eWEB n°169](#)).
- Since the 1<sup>st</sup> case of bird flu in Egypt, the case count is 150 cases including 52 deaths.
