REPORT OF NEW HEALTH EVENTS OCCURRING <u>OUTSIDE</u> THE EPISOUTH AREA (Not occurring in one or several EpiSouth countries)

Area: Gabon Event: Poliomyelitis <u>Comments</u>

- On 25th February 2011, Gabonese health authorities reported a case of poliomyelitis (WPV1) in Ogooué-lolo province in the south-eastern part of the country (cf. map 2).
- The date of onset of symptom is 15th January 2011.
- To date, we do not have any details regarding control measures nor immunization campaign implemented.

- The last polio case reported by the country to WHO was in 1996.
- Since beginning of October 2010, a polio outbreak (WPV1) has been occurring in the Republic of Congo, a neighbouring country, with nearly 300 confirmed cases.
- To date, no details are available regarding the viral strain circulating in Gabon. The introduction of the virus via the Republic of Congo is a hypothesis.
