Comments

- On 29<sup>th</sup> November 2011, the Egyptian health authorities reported to WHO one new human case of A(H5N1) in Dakahlia governorate (cf. map 1).
- The case is:
  - A 31 year-old female
  - With onset of symptoms on 10<sup>th</sup> November 2011
  - Hospitalised on 16<sup>th</sup> November 2011
  - She is in critical conditions
  - Contact with poultry has been documented.
- The last human A(H5N1) case in Egypt was reported on 2<sup>nd</sup> November 2011 (cf. [eWEB n°189](#)).
- To date, in total 153 cases including 52 deaths have been reported.
