- On 2nd December 2011, the Nepalese Ministry of Agriculture reported to [OIE](#) an A(H5N1) avian outbreak in domestic poultry in Bagmati zone, in the centre of the country (cf. map 1).
- The last A(H5N1) epizootic in Nepal was reported on 6th December 2010 (cf. [eWEB n°142](#)) in Narayani zone, close to Bagmati.
- There was no human case of A(H5N1) ever reported in Nepal.
