CHINA

- On 24th January 2012, the Ministry of Health of China has notified to [WHO](#) one new human case of A(H5N1) infection in Guizhou province (cf. map 1).
- The case was
 - a 39 years old male from Guiyan City;
 - Onset of symptoms on 6th January 2012;
 - He was hospitalised and died on 22nd January 2012;
 - Exposure to sick poultry is under investigation;
- The last A(H5N1) human case in China was reported on 31st December 2011 (cf. [eWEB n°198](#)) in Guangdong province.
- Only one case was reported in 2011 (cf. [eWEB n°198](#)) and 2 cases in 2010 (cf. [eWEB n°116](#) and [n°139](#)). To date, a total of 48 cases including 28 deaths have been reported in China.

EGYPT

- On 19th January 2012, The Ministry of Health and Population in Egypt notified to [WHO](#) two new human A(H5N1) cases in Cairo and Fayium governorate (cf. map 2).
- The first case reported in Cairo governorate was:
 - A 2 years old girl
 - Onset of symptoms reported on 30th October 2011
 - Contact with contaminated poultry has been documented.
- The second case reported in Fayium governorate was:
 - A 31 years old male
 - Onset of symptoms 1st January 2012
 - He is still in critical conditions.
- To date, 159 cases have been reported, including 55 deaths.
- The last human A(H5N1) case in Egypt was reported in Al Minufiyah on 25th December 2011 (cf. [eWEB n° 197](#)).

INDONESIA

- On 19th January 2012, the Ministry of health of Indonesia reported to [WHO](#) a human case of A(H5N1) in Jakarta province (cf. map 3).
- The case was:
 - A 5 years old girl
 - Diagnosed on 7th January 2012;
 - She died on 16th January 2012.
- She was a family contact of the last case reported on 11th January 2012 (cf. [eWEB n° 199](#)) in Jakarta. Common exposure to the same contaminated pigeons has been documented.
- To date, a total of 184 cases including 152 have been reported in Indonesia.

VIETNAM

- On 20th January 2011, the Vietnamese Ministry of Health has notified reported to [WHO](#) one new human case of A(H5N1) infection in Kien Giang province (cf. map 4).
- The case was
 - a 18 years old male;
 - Onset of symptoms on 10th January 2012;
 - He was hospitalised on 14th January 2012;
 - He died on 16th January 2012;
 - Exposure to ducks has been documented.
- The last A(H5N1) human case in Vietnam was reported on 12th April 2010 (cf. [eWEB n°108](#)) in Bac Kan province.
- To date, a total of 120 cases including 60 deaths have been reported in Vietnam.
